What does 'invite-only' funders mean?

These are funders (often trusts and foundations) that **do not accept open applications**. They only fund those they invite.

As their website says:

"We do not accept unsolicited requests".





Can we still send an application?

No prior contact or invite?

Respect the funders guidelines and <u>don't</u> send a proposal.





Is it **still worth** trying to get in touch with them?

Yes, it's worth trying. More funders are going 'invite-only' - about **1 in 2** grant-making foundations now follow this trend.

Why? Reasons include limited staff and resources, a focus on impact, and more niche funding areas.





So how to get noticed?

- Build connections first and understand how the funder 'ticks'
 LinkedIn helps!
- Show your value how can you help them succeed and what could you achieve together.
- Find your sweet spot understand the philanthropic
 'ecosystem' where the funder
 moves and how you fit in.





Are we visible enough?

- Your Profile: Is your mission clear and unique - problem, solution, impact?
- Your Website: Does it show the value of a potential partnership, not just ask for money?
- Your Annual Report: Does it highlight real impact with concrete examples of what funding has achieved?
